Don't be shy; there will be lots of new people and old, coming out of hibernation to meet. We plan to eat by late afternoon. Volleyball and horseshoes available. Y'all come!



REC TAGS

Tags must be worn by all Lake Christopher children under 18 and their guests beginning SATURDAY, MAY 23. If you haven't already picked yours up, these tags will be issued once again on SATURDAY, MAY 16, from 1 pm - 4 pm. After that date, they will be difficult to obtain. Without a tag, your kids will be asked to leave the rec area by the Security Guard, Bruce Cahill. There will be no exceptions to this rule!

GENERAL RULES FOR LAKE CHRISTOPHER COMMON AREAS (LANDING, BEACH, NARROWS AND WOODS)

1. PARKS open at 10:00 pm and close at sundown for all ages.
2. CHILDREN under 18 years of age will wear the authorized rec tags (red) attached to their clothing/swimsuit. Guests of residents must also comply by wearing the green tags. All children under 8 years of age shall be accompanied by their parents or other responsible adult while using the parks.
3. NO PETS are allowed in any of the common areas (leashed or otherwise). We request your cooperation in maintaining clean and disease-free areas for our toddlers and barefoot children.
4. SWIMMING will be at your own risk. One ring-style life preserver will be provided at each of the two swimming areas. These are NOT toys. Please do not treat them as such. They are for emergency use only. Designated swimming areas will be marked for the protection of swimmers - boaters beware!
5. FISHING from shore is prohibited at the Landing and Beach during weekends, but will be permitted at the discretion of the Security Guard during weekdays. We do encourage fishing 'tho.
6. BOATING safety can be guaranteed only by using PFDs and knowing the rules of the road. For your interest, Mr. Duncan Bell will hold boating classes starting May 18. Sailboats, Canoes, Rafts, and Windsurfers only. NO POWER BOATS ARE ALLOWED.
7. PARKING is at a premium. When launching a trailered boat, it is advised that you consider parking along Lake Christopher Drive or return your trailer home after your boat is in the water and safely secured.
8. SECURITY service will be provided during the summer, starting Memorial Day Weekend through Labor Day. Mr. Bruce Cahill will again be responsible for surveillance of our four parks. Any resident children not wearing their rec tags will be asked to leave the parks. Non-residents will not be permitted in our common areas unless as guests with tags. For those of you new to the community, the rec tag system with enforcement by Mr. Cahill, has proven very effective in keeping uninvited, non-residents out of our rec areas. If at any time a resident suspects a trespasser (clue: most likely un-tagged and smart-mouthed), you have the authority to call the police. Usually, threatening just that is sufficient in ridding the culprits.
9. TRASH receptacles have been provided at all parks. Please use them. Let's keep our natural amenities clean and beautiful.

With spring in full-bloom, it's lovely to drive through the community which has grown even more beautiful as we've neared completion of Lake Christopher.

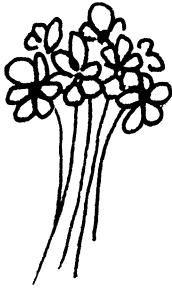
Three new homes are available for immediate occupancy and four of the six model homes remain for sale.

LIVING MEMORIALS

KEMPSVILLE ROAD WIDENING (see map on following page)

Kempsville Road will be widened to four lanes from Providence Road to south of Indian River Road and narrow to two lanes 90 feet north of Captains Run. This is not part of the Kempsville Road Widening Phase II, which is due to start construction in 1984. It's part of the Indian River Road widening and intersection improvement between Centerville Turnpike and Ferrell Parkway project, which has been approved, but for which no contract has been awarded, due to the present bid-rigging controversy.

KEMPSVILLE ROAD WIDENING (cont'd)

Don Trueblood, of the City Engineering Department, confirms that request has been made to extend the four-lane portion of Kempsville Road to south of Lake Christopher and to include a left-turn lane at Captains Run. It will soon be considered and our interest in it is known, but notes to him or the City Traffic Engineer may show support.

A public hearing on Kempsville Road, Phase II, may be held eventually. A traffic light at the intersection of Kempsville Road and Albright Drive is needed to relieve rush-hour and Brandon Junior High congestion. This traffic is multiplied by Brandon residents who are prevented from using their Brandon Boulevard/Centerville Turnpike entrance, but the remaining 20 feet of the boulevard is due to be completed in 6-8 weeks.
