1993 BILLING PROCEDURES ANNOUNCED

The homeowner assessment bills will be sent out on December 1 and payment will be due on January 31, 1993. Late fees will be charged starting February 1, 1993. Copies of the 1993 Budget will be included with the bill. Please reply promptly. If assessments are in arrears, the homeowner is ineligible to vote at the Annual Meeting and loses all privileges to and use of the Common Areas. non-payment of dues continues, the Homes Association will seek a judgement in court and liens placed on the property. All legal fees will be added to the original assessment plus late charges.

GRASS CARP UPDATE

As many of you know, the Association purchased several fish called Triploid Grass Carp which, upon release into the lake, will help control the growth of Pond Weed. These fish were introduced into the lake last April and for a variety of reasons 12 of the fish did not survive the transition. The company has replaced those fish at no cost to the Association. The

Board would appreciate being notified of any more dead fish spotted along the shores.

Please be reminded that the fish will not cure the problem of the weeds "overnight". This solution could take 2 to 3 seasons to work. It is, however, infinitely more desireable than using herbicides with their unpleasant side effects.


SOCIAL COMMITTEE SETS 1993 CALENDAR


Hi Neighbors,

LIFE AROUND THE LAKE



Stormwater pollution is a primary cause of our nation's water quality problems. Each time it rains, stormwater running off the streets and the land picks up pollutants and makes its way untreated into our rivers, bays and the ocean.

Improper use or over-use of fertilizers and pesticides can result in stormwater pollution. Motor oil, antifreeze, paint or other toxic substances that are dumped in storm drains wash into our waterways. Detergents from car washing, pet wastes and litter contribute to the problem. Even sweeping leaves into storm drains is detrimental.

Volunteers will be stenciling W.Q. Fish and the message "Dumping Pollutes" on storm drains in Virginia Beach. The storm drain stenciling project will raise public awareness of water quality problems.

Frances Flanigan, executive director of the Alliance for the Chesapeake Bay, will be here from Baltimore to help kick off the project.
